# TANYS Awards Not Merely Rumors

The Wellsville Secondary School Theatre Program has once again had success on the stage. The November 1st and 2nd performances of Neil Simon's *Rumors* gave audiences a laugh-out-loud theatre experience. The cast, directed by Matt Warren, had two quality performances that pleased young and old alike.

Wellsville Secondary School Nurse Hope Gilfert, who regularly attends shows at WSS, was blown away. She said, "*Rumors* was thoroughly enjoyable! ...I'll be reliving this play for the next six months... My family and I couldn't stop laughing."

Joan Luther, a representative of the Theatre Association of New York State (TANYS), came to adjudicate one of the performances. Adjudication is a process by which a trained theatre veteran with notable expertise from outside of the school watches the show and gives those involved feedback. When she introduced herself to the cast, crew, and production staff after the Friday night performance, Ms. Luther called herself an "educated audience member." She explained to those present that she read the script in advance in order to become familiar with the show and the playwright's intent.

Her feedback for the show was incredibly positive. "Students ...performed the classic Neil Simon farce *Rumors* with great energy. The play demands exact timing, perfect door slamming, and making sense out of complete nonsense. The audience loved it and the students performed with skill and competence."

## Physics Pupils Pitch Pumpkins

On Monday, November 4, students from Wellsville Secondary School's physics classes put their skills at launching projectiles on display. Students worked alone or in groups to construct devices to hurl pumpkins as far as possible. This was the basis of their first quarter project and the culmination of their study of projectile motion. For the launch, students constructed devices that ranged from free-standing slingshots to catapults to trebuchets to air cannons.

Because the construction portion of the project was completed outside of class, the teams were encouraged to get their families and neighbors to help. The results were wonderful!

The longest launch was made by an air cannon brought to the competition by Hunter Brandes (*see photo AT RIGHT*). His air cannon was built from repurposed materials and launched one pumpkin almost 190 yards.

The best launch for a non-air cannon was made with a trebuchet constructed by Kelleach Bailey, Eagan Enke, Austin Keib, and Conner Majewski (*see photo ABOVE*). Their pumpkin went over 36 yards and took second place in the competition.

Special thanks go out to Kent Farms which donated the pumpkins used for this year's launch. Whether the students' launchers flung the pumpkins far or not, everyone had a launcher there and analyzed the pumpkin's motion after the launch. They all did terrific work and should be proud of their pumpkin-pitching prowess.


