Big Cat Robotics Competes at C-R

On Wednesday, January 15, Wellsville's VEX Robotics team, Big Cat Robotics, competed in an official VEX Robotics Qualifying Tournament at Cuba-Rushford Middle-High School. This is Wellsville's second year competing in VEX Robotics, coached by Mr. Skrzynski. The competition included 27 teams from nearby schools in Allegany and Cattaraugus counties. This year's game, "Tower Takeover," is played on a 12' x 12' field and requires students to build a custom robot that must pick up cubes and place them in goal zones, or in towers, to score points for their alliance. There are four teams on the gaming field during each match, two for each alliance. Students must program their robot to move without control for the first 15-seconds of the match, with the team scoring the most points receiving a bonus. After the 15-second autonomous period, teams can control their robot to navigate the gaming field and score points for their team.

Despite missing out on the finals, Wellsville's Big Cat Robotics took home one of only three awards that are given out at officially sanctioned VEX Robotics events. Wellsville's team received the Judges Award, which is given to the team deserving of special accomplishments during the competition. Judges consider a number of possible criteria for this award, such as team displays of special attri-

butes, exemplary effort and perseverance at the event, or team accomplishments or endeavors throughout the season that may not fit under existing awards but are nonetheless deserving of special recognition.

Big Cat Robotics will next compete in the "VEX in the Valley" tournament at Canaseraga CSD on Saturday, February 8.

A 300 Year Event

The flood of 1972 was the worst natural disaster to affect the Wellsville area in over a century. The impact on the community was immense. Hundreds of people were evacuated from their homes and relocated to neighboring towns, and Allegany County was left with an estimated twenty million dollars' worth of damage - two thirds of which was claimed by the town of Wellsville alone. The rain began on Tuesday, June 20th...

A group of Wellsville Secondary seniors has produced a website on the history of the 1972 flood that radically changed Wellsville's landscape.

The site, which can be found at <https://sites.google.com/wlsv.org/flood/home>, includes photos, historical artifacts, and interviews with community members.

Heavy rains, the remnants of Hurricane Agnes, deluged Wellsville in June of 1972, flooding homes and businesses. The rapidly rising Genesee River caused a wing of Jones Memorial Hospital to collapse. Regents exams were canceled and graduation had to be postponed.

Students learned about the flood in Madonna Figura Simon's English classes.

They produced the website on Community Service Day in the fall. Community Service

Day is part of the seniors' Participation in Government class, taught by Matt Burke.

SENIORS CREATE LITERARY PORTFOLIOS - Students in Mr. Warren's English 10 and 10 Honors classes recently finished reading Harper Lee's classic novel, *"To Kill a Mockingbird."* To assess their understanding of the novel, students created literary



portfolios, which showcased various elements from the book. Students demonstrated their knowledge of the novel's characters, conflicts, and themes, and connected the text to our world today. 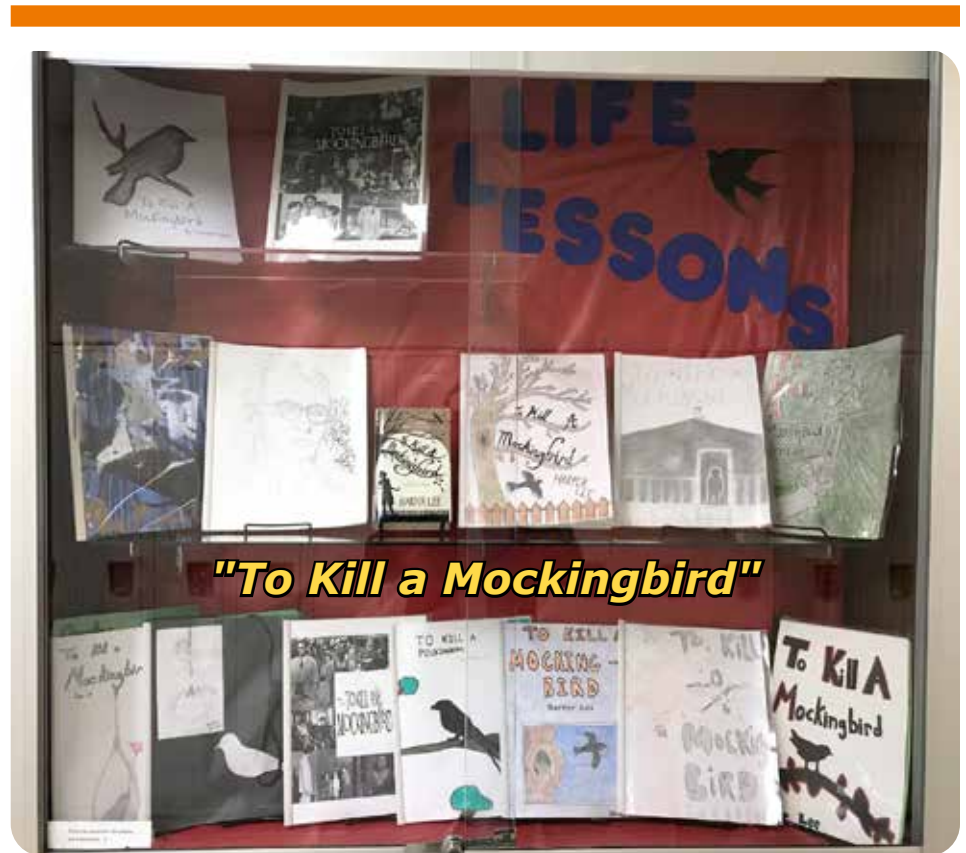

Pre-Kindergarten/Kindergarten Registration

We are beginning to plan for the next school year. To help us in our planning, we will be conducting our annual Pre-kindergarten/Kindergarten registration at the Elementary School. To be eligible to attend our grant funded Universal Pre-Kindergarten program in September 2020 a child must be **4** years old by December 1, 2020. To be eligible to attend our Kindergarten in September 2020, a child must be **5** years old by December 1, 2020. It is very important that you register your child for these classes.

Please fill out a "Registration Form" which appears on our web page, www.wellsvilleschools.org. There is a registration form for Pre-Kindergarten and one for Kindergarten. If you would like the school to mail one home to you, please call 596-2122 or you may stop by and pick one up.

On the day of registration please bring the following documents with you:

- *Proof of Residency in Wellsville Central School District (a utility bill-gas or electric, tax bill, or statement from landlord)*
- *Completed Registration Packet*
- *Copy of Birth Certificate (Must be original, not the souvenir one from the hospital)*
- *Parent/Guardian Photo Identification*
- *Copy of Immunization Records*
- *Documentation of any Allergies or Health Conditions*
- *Copy of Custody Papers and/or Order of Protection (if applicable)*
- *Department of Social Services Foster Placement Form (if applicable)*

Tuesday, April 28, 2020 from 9:30am-12:30pm AND 5pm-7pm

Thursday, April 30, 2020 from 3:30 pm- 8pm

Please Note: Registration forms that are completed beforehand shorten registration time. At registration, someone will meet with you to review all of the documents that you have brought. You do not need to bring your child to register him or her. Parents who register their child(ren) will be notified of the Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten Screening process. Screening normally takes place in June or July.
