




6th Grade Bahama's STEAM Collaboration

On Tuesday, February 25, the sixth Grade STEAM Design teams attended St Bonaventure University with myself, Mrs. Bump (sixth grade science teacher), and Mrs. Scholes (Family Resource Coordinator). In Mrs. Bump's STEAM class, the students have collaborated with St. Bonaventure's BonaResponds (student volunteer service group) to create two sensory





paths for Mary Star of the Sea Academy in Freeport, Bahamas. The 22 students worked quickly to conference with their new client via Skype, and then research, design, and print the vinyl stickers for two pathways in less than three weeks! Seven students then gave a fantastic presentation (see photo ABOVE) on what they created to a group of 20 people, which included three college professors and a mixture of undergraduate and graduate students pursuing degrees in many different fields. The purpose of the presentation was to inform the college students about sensory pathways and give them directions on how to install the pathway in the Bahamas when they go there next week as a part of the BonaResponds program. This is a perfect example of a collaborative STEAM education project and both groups are excited to collaborate again in the future.



Impressive Showing for Robotics Teams at VEX Qualifier

The Wellsville Secondary School Robotics teams -- coached by Mr. Skrzynski -- competed in the "VEX in the Valley" robotics qualifying event held on Saturday, February 8, at Canaseraga CSD. After their first competition in January, the students split into separate teams and brought two robots to the competition consisting of 19 teams from the region. After the qualifying rounds were completed, Wellsville's Big Cat Robotics team, led by senior Eric Morehouse, placed second overall with a record of 7-1-0 and placed fourth overall in the Skills Competition (at top right). Wellsville's newest team, The Large Predators, led by freshman Kavan O'Grady, finished seventh overall with a record of 4-3-1 and placed sixth overall in the Skills Competition (at top right).

Each of Wellsville's teams had the opportunity to select their alliance partner for the tournament round. After upsetting the tournament's top seed, Wellsville's team, The Large Predators, made it to the finals after some excellent driving by Kavan O'Grady and assistance from sophomore

Drive Team members, Jack Jordan and Luke Zakel. Despite both Wellsville teams coming up just short of qualifying for the state tournament, Big Cat Robotics again earned the "Judges Award," their second in as many competitions.
