Principal's Message

Mariners,

Welcome students and families to Murdock Middle School's 24-25 school year. I hope you had a great summer break and were able to spend time with family and friends. Our entire Mariner family is looking forward to having you on campus, and in our classrooms. Before we focus on the start of 24-25, I want to recognize a few outstanding accomplishments in 23-24. Our Science Department had a turnaround this year. Science is possibly the most difficult and certainly the most comprehensive Florida State Test in middle school, and our students had significant gains for the first time in four years. This turnaround did not happen by chance. We chose to make science a priority in our School Improvement Plan. As a result, our teachers developed and executed a plan to help our students grow in this important academic area. Our PTO and SAC supported this plan and our students did the work. As a result, our students had significant gains for the first time in four years. Other equally impressive academic gains were accomplished in Math, and Algebra 1. We had more students earn a high school credit in Alg1 this year than at any other time in the past 10 years. We also had 19 eighth grade students earn two industry certifications in just one year. For the first time we added Chorus as an exploratory and witnessed these students join our Mighty Mariner Band in two spectacular concerts.

One of our primary objectives has been to make Murdock Middle School a place where students want to attend, teachers want to teach, staff want to work, and parents and the community are proud to call their own. This year we witnessed this objective being achieved. Our community came out in large numbers to support their students. The crowds at our awards ceremonies, sporting events, and concerts were frequently standing room only. We filled all the bleachers and chairs at our 6th grade riser night

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with the crowd spilling over into the rest of the gym. Viewership of our Mariner Studio's live streaming continues to grow as does our Facebook following. Our Technology Department continues to shine. In a recent district meeting the Director of Career and Technology stated "Murdock Middle Schools' Technology program is a high school program being executed on a middle school campus". This year that department will partner with FPL to feature a drone program, another will partner with CTC to introduce students to careers in high paying jobs in Robotics and Electronics. By the end of semester one our 8th grade students will select an initial pathway for their future. This is an initiative started by our superintendent referred to as the Three E's, Enrollment, Employment, or Enlistment.

While we have much to celebrate, we have room for improvement. Our greatest need for improvement is in the area of Literacy. Our students are behind in the areas of Reading and Language Arts. This effects their growth in every subject area. As a result, we will build growth in these areas as a priority in our School improvement Plan for this coming school year. Mariner Families, our students need your help to overcome the gaps they have in this subject area. You can help support them by doing two important things. First, make sure they are in school every day - all day. Students that miss just 10% of class time fall behind the other students. That is just 2 days per month. Two days per month is equal to missing four weeks of school. Three days a month six weeks! Students just cannot keep up with their classmates when they miss more than one day per month. Second, check their grades in Focus every week. Select a day maybe Monday or Friday. Check their grades and make sure they turn in any missing work. When we work together, parents and teachers, our students will learn and excel.

I am confident that with your support and with us working together the students of Murdock Middle School will continue to grow and will make our community proud.

Despite being the "small" middle school in our District, we are three-time boys' basketball county champs, three-time girls' track county champs, and our girls' Volleyball Team went undefeated winning a championship. 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Anti-Bullying Policy

Charlotte County Public Schools does not tolerate bullying, which includes cyberbullying. Throughout the school year, our schools do a variety of classroom, large group, and small group lessons on bullying and bully prevention.

Though we teach all of our students that bullying is wrong, it still occasionally occurs. And, while we would like cases of bullying to be reported to the administration, they are not always reported.

Parents - if you have a bully (or cyberbullying) concern please let us know. If your child is a target and is being bullied or if you believe

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your child bullies others, please let us know. Open and consistent communications with the school will not only help your child but will help many others and the school. Unfortunately, some bully situations take a number of interventions before it subsides. Please continue to communicate with the school and provide any additional information that will help the school put an end to the situation.

It is important to note that investigation of cyberbullying can occur regardless of whether the bullying was conducted using public or private property (cell phone, computers, etc). Please reference Florida Statute 1006.47

District ID Badges

It is district policy that all students must wear an I.D. badge while on campus during school hours: "In order to maintain a high level of student safety, students are required to wear school issued identification badges during regular school hours. Student identification badges must be worn around the neck using a school-provided breakaway lanyard." The first I.D. badge and break-away lanyard is provided to the student free of charge. Students will be charged a fee for forgotten or lost I.D's or lanyards. Students may wear a break-away lanyard of their choice as long as it meets all dress code requirements. Please refer to the new updated Student Code of Conduct for any more information regarding student I.D. badges.

School Hours

First period begins every morning at 9:10. The school day ends at 4:10. Any student arriving to campus after 9:10 MUST report to the front office to obtain a tardy pass. Tardy passes are required for both excused and unexcused tardiness.

Arrivals

The parent drop off gate will open at 8:00AM and close at 9:30 each morning. There is no supervision on campus between 8:00-8:30 am. The pedestrian gates used by students walking or riding their bike to school will open at 8:30AM and close at 9:30. Students walking or riding should NOT arrive before 8:30 as the sidewalk gates will be locked. Campus gates open for students at 8:40. Upon entering campus students will report directly to either their grade level pod (D Pod for 6th grade, G Pod for 7th Grade and B Pod for 8th Grade) or the cafeteria for breakfast.

Dismissal

Students are dismissed at 4:10. Any student riding a bus should go directly to the bus ramp. Walkers and bike riders exit campus using the sidewalk gate beside our marquee. Students going to parent pick up proceed directly to the font off the Administrative Building and MUST be picked up by 4:30.



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
