Website and Course Overview—AICE General Paper

- Spilt class: 1st quarter focuses solely on AICE General Paper. Quarter 2 and 3 focus on FL Best Standards. Quarter 4 is blended to prepare students for the AICE and FAST Exams.
 - Allow students to focus on content specific to each course instead of a blended approach. AICE Exam in October. Final FAST ELA Exam in May.
- AICE General Paper follows the Cambridge course outline. Focus on global issues to develop reading, writing, reasoning, and analytical skills.
- The curriculum also prepares students for the FAST ELA Reading Exam. Students will be tested three times during the year (PM1, PM2, PM3), and passing the PM3 is a graduation requirement.
