Instructor Biography: Hello and welcome to my class! My name is Mark Hertz and this is my 10<sup>th</sup> year teaching at Lemon Bay High School. I have been in the education profession for 20 years teaching many subjects at different levels. I am primarily an English teacher, holding a Master's Degree in English with an emphasis Teaching Writing. Before Lemon Bay, I taught at L.A. Ainger Middle School here in Englewood, eight years at Six Rivers Charter High School in Arcata, a small rural town on the north coast of California, Freshmen Composition at Humboldt State University, and Humanities at Academy of the Redwoods in Eureka, CA. I am a father of two amazing boys, and my wife and I love living in southwest Florida! I look forward to a successful and rewarding year!

<u>NOTE</u>: The cost of the AICE General Paper Exam is \$125. This fee is paid by the school. Your child's attendance is mandatory for the test dates. If you child 'no shows' on the test date, you will be charged the \$125 fee. You will be provided testing dates with at least a month's notice.

**State and AICE Testing:** Because of the rigorous testing schedule required by the State of Florida, and because we are an AICE class, Lemon Bay High School has a unique way we teach the 10<sup>th</sup> grade AICE General Paper course. The first two months of the course are dedicated to the AICE General Paper Curriculum, and students will test at the end of September. Students who do not pass in their first attempt will have another chance in the spring.

Then, the course will focus on the FL BEST ELA Standards October through March. This would be the traditional English 2 curriculum. Students will be taking the State (FAST) ELA Reading exam three times throughout the year (PM 1, PM 2, and PM 3). The final assessment (PM3) will count as the graduation requirement.

April and May would then focus on both the AICE General Paper curriculum and the FL BEST Standards as students are reviewing and preparing for their FAST ELA Reading PM3 and AICE General Paper exams.

<u>Google Drive and Canvas:</u> Since many assignments require the use of a computer for research and word processing, students are issued a MS One Drive and Google Drive account through Charlotte County Public Schools. This is free to all students and easy to access. **In addition, many assignments will be turned in through the CANVAS learning management system.** If your child is sick or absent, they will be able to access lessons through the CANVAS site.

I will have the Canvas page on the projector during open house. Parents are encouraged to the access their child's Canvas page throughout the course of the year.

<u>Description of Course/Syllabus:</u> On the first day of school, your child will be given a course syllabus. Please read and sign it, and have your child bring it back to class. The syllabus provides an overview of the course and detailed information about class policies. There will also be course overviews and unit guides posted to each classes respective Canvas page. The unit guide will have a list of all assignments for that particular time period.
