District News

District will provide free meals to all enrolled students for the remainder of the 2020-2021 school year

Baldwinsville Central School District's Food Service Department is making sure all students have access to free, healthy meals while the COVID-19 pandemic continues to create challenges for many families.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has extended flexibilities it granted to school meal programs to provide free breakfast and lunch for

all children 18 and younger – whether learning in-person or remote – through the end of the school year. Enrolled students in the Baldwinsville Central School District can now receive breakfast and

lunch at no cost.



Meals are free for all B'ville students on the days they are receiving in-person instruction. Families can pick up meals for when their children are learning remotely. Families can pick up meals for their enrolled students on the last day of in-school instruction. Pickup will be located at Baker High School from 4 until 5:30 p.m. on those days. Meals are available for 100% remote learners on the last day of in-school instruction for each cohort. All enrolled students are eligible for a free breakfast and lunch meal every school day, regardless of family income.

Attention Parents: District conducting online kindergarten census

The District is requesting the parents of children who will be eligible for kindergarten in September 2021 to participate in the District's online, non-school age census by January 31, 2021. This is not the kindergarten registration, but a census to provide the District with the necessary information to establish a list to email kindergarten registration information to parents. In order to be



eligible for kindergarten in September 2021, a child must be five years old by December 1, 2021.

Kindergarten open registration for the 2021–2022 school year will take place starting in February 2021. An informational email will be sent to pre-registered student parents at that time. This will provide details for parents regarding the requirements needed to complete the registration process. All students are screened before entering kindergarten. More information on this process will be sent out in the spring.





A message from School Nurse Supervisor, Dr. Jule Carpenter DNP, FNP:


School nursing was challenging even before COVID-19 hit! Our nurse
