## Food Service News

### How to find summer meals:

The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) is a federally-funded, state-administered program that works to ensure children have access to nutritious meals and snacks when school is not in session.

### School Meal Changes for 2022-2023 School Year:

The USDA did not extend all of the waivers that were available during COVID. Many of these waivers gave us the flexibility to serve all students at no charge. Moving forward to the 2022-2023 school year, families can qualify for free and reduced meals by filling out a family application as we did prior to COVID.

## Health Services News

### ATTENTION: Important Health Information for 2022-2023

All NYS public school students must submit a copy of a physical exam when they are entering the District for the first time AND/OR entering grades K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 & 11. According to New York State Education Law, beginning January 31, 2021 physical examinations for school are to be documented on the NYS Required Health Examination Form or an electronic health record equivalent form. If a physical was required for the 2020-2021 school year and you were not able to acquire one, please submit the required physical exam from by September 8th. To access the state form and for more information on required physicals and immunizations your child may need for the 2021-2022 school year, visit the Health Services page at [www.bville.org](http://www.bville.org).



With the 2021-2022 school year students 11 years old or older entering grades 6-12 are required to have one dose of Tdap. Students entering grades 7, 8, 9, 10 or 11th grade are required to have one dose of the meningococcal vaccine; a booster dose is required for 12th grade if the first dose was received before 16 years old. The District is mandated to exclude students that do not meet the criteria set forth in the New York State Immunizations for School Attendance for the 2021-2022 school year, which you can find on the our Health Services webpage. Immunizations work to keep vaccine preventable diseases out of the schools and protect children from serious consequences from vaccine preventable diseases.

Your child's annual physical examination appointment is an ideal time to speak with your healthcare provider regarding vaccines. Primary care providers are welcoming patients back into their offices for important comprehensive wellness exams, to evaluate vaccination status and to share important health information. Please call your provider now to schedule your well child exam!

## 2022-2023 Schedules & Bus Information in Parent Portal on August 26, 2022

The 2022-2023 bus information, class lists, schedules, and teacher assignments for students will be available in the parent portal on Friday, August 26, 2022.

School Supply lists for the 2022-2023 school year are available on the Baldwinsville Central School District website at [www.bville.org](http://www.bville.org). Supply lists are available for each grade level and are the same district-wide. Lists are also located on individual school webpages.



## Deadline for Request for Transportation for Day Care is August 24, 2022

The District establishes bus routes for the new school year over the summer months. Due to safety concerns, changes to daycare/sitter stops or bus stops for the newly established routes will be processed on a first come, first serve basis from Thursday, August 25, 2022 to Friday, September 16, 2022.

**Day care/sitter forms received after August 24, 2022 will be processed to take effect only with email notification from the transportation office. You must submit a request form for day care/sitter transportation EVERY YEAR, even if your daycare/sitter is the same as the previous year.**

You can download a Request for Transportation form from the Transportation Department's webpage.

Please submit it by **5 p.m. August 24, 2022**, to ensure your child has transportation on the first day of school, **September 7, 2022**.

## Results from the 2020-21 NYS Report Card

### 2020-21 Building Accountability

As you will note, 6 of our 8 schools have achieved the status of Good Standing, based on ratings outlined in the Every Student Succeeds Act. A school in Good Standing demonstrates success in all performance goals. Elden Elementary School and Durgee Junior High School have been designated as Targeted Support and Improvement. Schools with this designation struggle to prepare certain subgroups (such as students with disabilities or certain racial/ethnic groups) but not all of their students with some or all the indicators of success.
