Capital Improvement Project

Funding improvements & building the Future

Phase 2

The Facilities Committee has been working on a long-range infrastructure plan with a focus on maximizing the District's state aid and optimizing opportunities for students. The initial Phase 1 project was approved by the voters in May of 2022 and included major renovations at Durgee Junior High School. Phase 1 is in the design phase and work is expected to begin in 2023. The Phase 2 proposal will be presented to voters on May 16, 2023.


The majority of work will be at Ray Middle School, C.W. Baker High School and athletic complex located on the District's main campus. The project proposal also includes additional minor infrastructure upgrades at Durgee Junior High School and Elden Elementary School.

The Phase 2 project was carefully designed to support students across the district. This project allows for future work that could support grade level realignment and provide a foundation for future projects that will include our elementary schools. There will be a minimal amount of work at Durgee Junior High School and Elden Elementary School to ensure we continue to improve our infrastructure. The proposed site work on the main campus will expand our ability to have more students participating in events closer to the school they attend.


Here are some highlights of the Phase 2 project:

C.W. Baker High School

- Proposed gym expansion that will provide a space for all students to gather and accommodate guests attending events more comfortably.
- The gym expansion will also include a raised indoor track and locker rooms will be refreshed.
- The pool relocation will provide our students with a six-lane pool for competitions and physical education instruction.
- There will be STEAM upgrades with the refresh of science classrooms.
- A new Multipurpose Turf Field is proposed for Athletics and the Arts.
- There will be a new separate campus access road for parent drop-off/pick-up located at the South side of Baker High School. This will help create a safe traffic flow while on the main campus.




Ray Middle School

 The proposed work for Ray Middle School will support interdisciplinary and ageappropriate learning in ELA, history, world languages, math and science.

- This work will support current students as well as allow discussions to continue regarding the potential of having our 5th and 6th grade learners together at an earlier age.
- Renovated classrooms including fine and performing arts, ensemble as well as new collaboration and breakout spaces and an age-appropriate outdoor wellness space is included in this project.

- This project will also include gymnasium and locker room reconfigurations.
- There will also be sitework upgrades including the bus loop and green spaces to provide safe traffic flow.




When reviewing the Phase 2 project, the Facilities Committee maintained a focus of maximizing the District's state aid and minimizing the impact on the tax levy. The proposed project is \$63.9 million and will be funded by \$48.8 million in State Building Aid, \$7.5 million from the Capital Reserve Fund and \$7.6 million from the local share. Taxes are projected to increase by approximately \$16.61 for a home with a market value of \$100,000 or \$41.53 for a home with a market value of \$250,000.

As the District continues its long range plan, there will be a committee generated to review the Funding the Future work. The review will focus on new data including lasting change from the pandemic and the addition of Universal Pre-Kindergarten funding. The Facilities Committee anticipates that the next proposed project will



be presented to voters as a larger project with multiple phases due to the impact each phase will have on the next.

The attached drawings of Baker, Ray and the multi-purpose field are conceptual in nature and based on initial discussions.

Kindergarten, UPK Registration information for 2023-24 school year

The Baldwinsville Central School District is requesting the parents of children who will be eligible for Kindergarten or the Universal Pre-K (UPK) program in September 2023 to participate in the district's online pre-registration by **January 27, 2023. Please Note:** In order to be age eligible for Kindergarten for the 2023-2024 school year, a child must be five years old by December 1, 2023. For the UPK program, the child's birth date must be between 12/2/2018 and 12/1/2019.



This is not the Kindergarten/UPK registration, but a census to provide the district with the necessary information to establish a list to email registration information to parents.

Kindergarten and UPK open registration for the 2023–2024 school year will take place starting on January 30, 2023. We will send an informational email to pre-registered student parents at that time. This will provide details for parents regarding the requirements needed to complete the registration process. All students are screened before entering the programs; you will receive more information on this process in the springtime.

- The 2022-2023 Application for Free and Reduced Price School Meals is available to families throughout the school year. If you have changes to your family circumstances, including income or size of household, please submit an application at any time during the school year. You can find the application on our website, www.bville.org, on our food service webpage. Our goal is to make sure that every family in our district who qualifies for this program will receive this benefit.
- Rising food costs continue to hit grocery stores and restaurants, and our schools are also feeling the impact. The cost of school breakfast and lunch are set for the year, but during these challenging times of rising supply chain costs we may have to raise the prices on some a la carte items. Price changes would be introduced after the start of the calendar year. We'll keep you updated on any changes moving forward.


