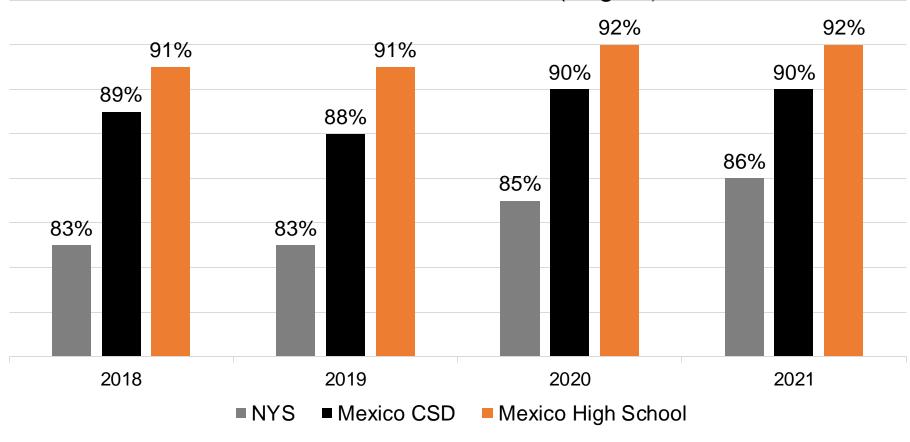

Revenue Sources

- **STATE AID** –based on the NY State Budget
 - 56% of total revenue
- TAX LEVY Monies collected from district taxpayers via school tax bills and limited by the Property Tax Cap Legislation.
 21% of total revenue
- LOCAL NON-TAX PILOTs, use of district reserves and miscellaneous revenues
 - 17% of total revenue
- FUND BALANCE Unrestricted monies that can be appropriated into next year's budget
 - 6% of total revenue

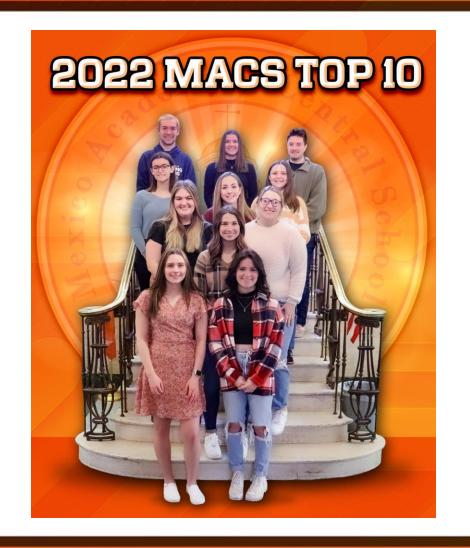

Three-Part Budget

The State legislation, which requires the state's school districts to have a public budget vote, includes the requirement that the budget be divided up into three components: program, capital, and administration.







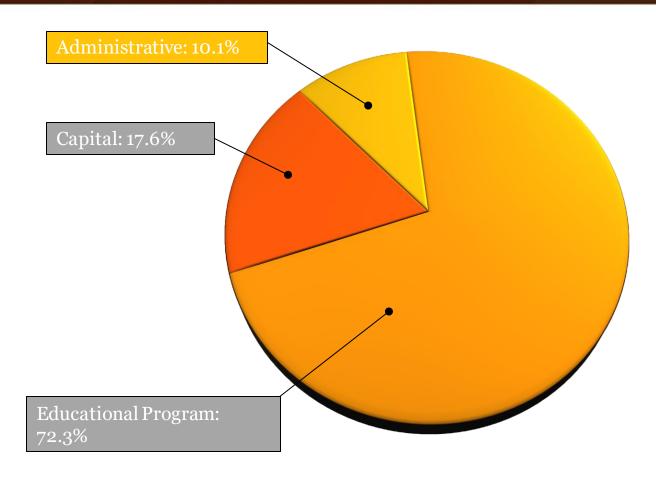
Three-Part Budget

- 1. <u>ADMINISTRATION BUDGET</u>: This section includes District Clerk & BOE expenses, Annual Meeting/Vote, Registrar, Superintendent's Office, Business Office, HR Office, Tax Collector, Legal Fees, PR Services, Receiving & Mailing, BOCES Capital & Admin expenses, All building Principals & Clerical Support and the corresponding benefits expense for all of these areas.
- **EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM BUDGET**: This portion covers teacher salaries and benefits, instructional media & technology, pupil services (guidance, health, psychologists), clubs, athletics, pupil transportation, recreation, civic, legal expenses, school supplies, and all other related educational costs.
- **3.** <u>CAPITAL BUDGET</u>: Refers to all facilities costs including, custodial salaries and benefits, annual debt service, service contracts, custodial supplies, and maintenance and repair of facilities.

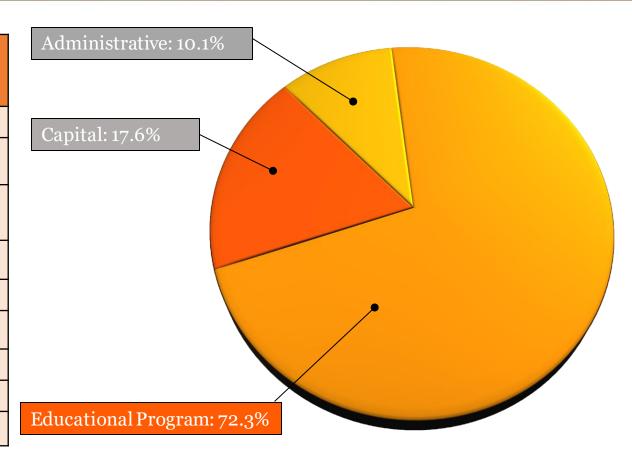

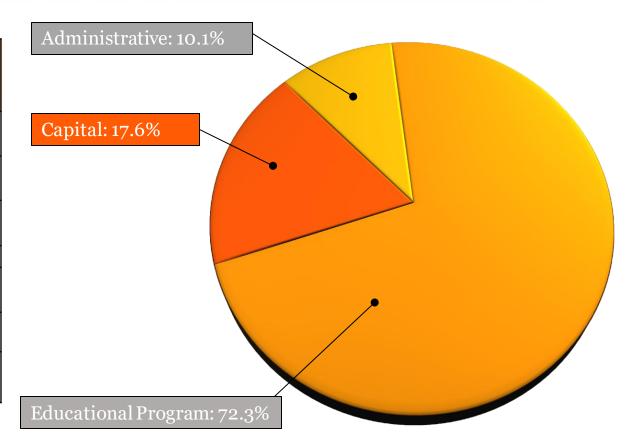

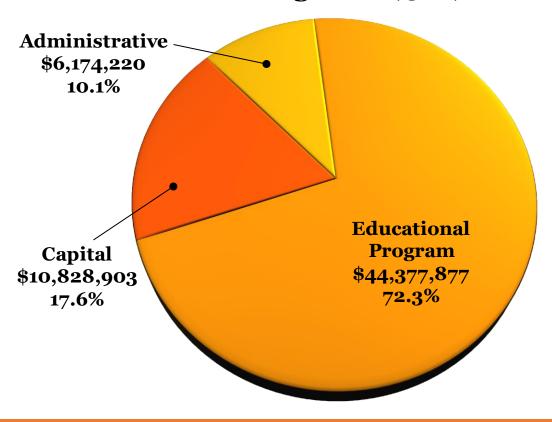

What is a Contingency Budget?

If the Budget does not pass, the District has two options:

- 1. Adjust the budget and present to the public for a re-vote in June
- 2. BOE can approve a Contingency Budget

Contingency Budget Removes Non-Contingent Expenses by law:

- Majority of Equipment (Health and Safety Equipment allowed)
- Community Use of Facilities including Fitness Center, Pool and Athletic Fields
- Salary increases for certain non-represented employees
- Tax Levy cannot be higher than the previous year

BUDGET VOTE & SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS

Voters will be asked to decide upon five (5) propositions, including the adoption of the proposed budget for the school year commencing July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023, and to elect two (2) Board of Education members.

PROPOSITION I – THE BUDGET

Shall the proposed budget for the Mexico Central School District as recommended by the Board of Education for the fiscal year beginning July 1,2022, in the amount of \$61,381,000 be adopted and shall the Board of Education be authorized to levy the necessary taxes, therefor?

PROPOSITION IV – Turf Capital Reserve Fund

Shall the following proposition be adopted, to wit?: BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Mexico Central School District is hereby authorized to establish a Capital Reserve Fund pursuant to Section 3651 of the Education Law, to be designated "2022 Turf Capital Reserve Fund," to defray the cost to, in whole or in part, finance renovation of the School District's athletic turffield including all costs incidental thereof, and in order to accomplish the same, in an amount not to exceed Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$900,000,000) plus accrued interest and other investment earnings. The 2022 Turf Capital Reserve Fund shall have a probable term of ten (10) years. The Board of Education is hereby authorized to pay into the 2022 Turf Capital Reserve Fund in the 2021-22 school year and annually thereafter funds from the School District's available funds balance. State aid reimbursement to the School District, such other monies as the voters may direct, and other legally available funds of the School District, including funds generated by field use fees, in an amount determined by the Board of Education up to the maximum authorized amount.

PROPOSITION II – Student Transportation

Shall the Board of Education purchase and finance seven (7) student transportation vehicles at an estimated cost not to exceed \$700,000.00 including necessary furnishings, fixtures and equipment and all other costs incidental thereto and to expend a total sum not to exceed \$700,000.00 which is estimated to be the total maximum cost thereof, and levy a tax for the foregoing in the amount of \$700,000.00 which shall be levied and collected in annual installments in such years and in such amounts as may be determined by the Board of Education and in anticipation of the collection of such tax, bonds and notes of the District are hereby authorized to be issued at one time or from time to time in the principal amount not to exceed \$700,000.00 and a tax is hereby voted to pay the interest on said obligations when due?

PROPOSITION V – Mexico Public Library

Shall the sum of Eighty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$85,000), which is an increase of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) over the existing levy of Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000), be raised by annual levy of a tax upon the taxable real property within the Mexico Academy & Central School District for the purpose of funding the Mexico Public Library?

PROPOSITION III – Capital Reserve Fund

Shall the following proposition be adopted, to wit?: RESOLVED, that in accordance with Education Law section 3651, the Board of Education of the Mexico Academy and Central School District is hereby authorized to establish a Capital Reserve Fund, to be designated "2022 Capital Reserve Fund," to defray the cost of construction and reconstruction of School District buildings, facilities and grounds, including original equipment, machinery, apparatus, appurte nances, furnishings, and other incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith, in an ultimate amount not to exceed Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) plus accrued interest and other investment earnings. The 2022 Capital Reserve Fund shall have a probable term often (10) years. The Board of Education is further authorized to pay into the 2022 Capital Reserve Fund in the 2021-2022 school year and annually thereafter funds from the School District's available funds balance, State aid reimbursement to the School District on account of capital projects, such other monies as the voters may direct, and other legally available funds of the School District in an amount determined by the Board of Education up to the maximum authorized amount.

ABSENTEE BALLOT

Voters can vote in-person or request an absentee ballot application (COVID-19 is a valid reason to request an absentee ballot).

If there is a qualified voter that is not registered with Oswego County Board of Elections or has not voted in an annual or special school election in the last four years, contact the District Clerk Harmony M. Rice by email at HRice@mexicocsd.org or call 315-963-8400 ext. 5401.

VOTERS FOR DISTRICT

Voters must possess the following qualifications to register:

- Be a citizen of the United States
- Be at least eighteen (18) years of age
- Be a resident of the District for a period of at least 30 days prior to the day of the vote
- Who is not otherwise ineligible to vote under the provisions of section 5-106 of the Election Law

To be counted, completed absentee ballots must be received in the Office of the District Clerk by 5:00 p.m. on May 17, 2022.

VOTER QUALIFICATIONS

- Citizen of the United States
- At least eighteen (18) years of age
