▶ SHPS

- New HVAC system installed Summer, 2018 w/sensors
- SHUSD IT staff to program the network for remote access

► SHES/RLS/SHHS

- Awaiting a quote from Pelican Systems for new controllers, wireless access
- SHES: All new controls needed to allow for remote access through SHUSD network. Estimated cost for all new system <u>plus</u> controllers: \$1,600,000 (2020-2022 Proposed Project List)
- SHHS: 12 HVAC units need to be converted over to Honeywell at the high school – awaiting quote
- o Will either have dual systems (Honeywell/Pelican) or just Pelican

Vintage Hall:

The original 2017-2019 Project List included a budget of \$84,000 to replace HVAC throughout the building. <u>Update</u>: Staff will replace the actuating valve and spider controller in each room over time at cost of \$2,700 per room. IT team to connect to the network

SHHS MARQUEE UPDATE:

Issue:

The SHHS marquee located on Main Street is not approved by the Department of the State Architect (DSA)

Option1:

Reinstall the existing marquee sign at the front of the campus on a new DSA approved foundation system. Product information required (model number, etc.)

Option 2:

Replace entirely; e.g. with a ground mounted solution or possibly a

wall-mounted marquee on the Rudd Building

Considerations:

- -Visibility
- -Technology (security of system)
- -Cost

Next Steps: Staff is determining which will be the most feasible, cost-effective solution



SHHS SCOREBOARD UPDATE:

Issue:

The SHHS football field scoreboard, which is 17 years old, is not approved by the Department of the State Architect (DSA)

Option1:

Reinstall the existing scoreboard on a new DSA approved foundation system. Product information required (model number, etc.)

Option 2:

Replace entirely; e.g. with a ground mounted solution

Considerations:

- Visibility
- -Cost

Next Steps: Staff is determining which will be the most feasible, cost-effective solution
