


High School Art News and Upcoming Events







To be eligible to attend our Kindergarten in September 2017, a child must be **5** years old by December 1, 2017. It is very important that you register your child for these classes.

- Copy of Custody Papers and/or Order of Protection (if applicable)
- Department of Social Services Foster Placement Form (if applicable)

**If your child is already enrolled in the Wellsville Elementary Pre-K Program you do not need to attend this to register for Kindergarten. You will receive separate paperwork to continue registration into Kindergarten.

Please Note: Registration forms that are completed beforehand shorten registration time. At registration, someone will meet with you to review all of the documents that you have brought. You do not need to bring your child to register him or her. Parents who register their child(ren) will be notified of the upcoming parent meeting to review the Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten Screening process. Screening normally takes place in July.

Wellsville High School recently held its annual Hall of Fame Ceremony. This year's inductees included Jeff Anderton, Ian Cannon, Kevin Cudney, and Ashley Walker. Here is a brief bio for each former WHS athlete . . .

Ashley Walker (Class of 2003)

Varsity Sports Years: Soccer – three, Basketball – four, Track – one, and Golf – one.

College: Alfred State College

Ashley was a star in both basketball and soccer receiving several All-Star awards in her high school career. In basketball, she was a starter on two consecutive sectional title teams.

At Alfred State, in 2003, in the sport of soccer, Ashley had 20 goals and seven assists, which earned her a place on the Western Conference All-Star Team. The next year, she did even better, scoring 23 goals with five assists. Once again, she was chosen to the Western Conference All-Star Team, as well as making the All-Region Second Team.

She will always be remembered as an outstanding athlete, who always put her team ahead of personal achievements.

Ian Cannon (Class of 2005)

Varsity Sports Years: Soccer – three, and Track – four.

College: RIT

In soccer, Ian Cannon was an outstanding defender anchoring a defense which only gave up a school record eight goals against in 2005. Ian was also a team captain of the 2004 and 2005 Boys Track Team that won back to back sectional championships.

For three years, Ian was chosen to participate in the Super 8 Track meet, which represents the best of the best in the Big 30 area. He also captured the 110 Hurdle Section V Championship his junior and senior years. In 2005, he broke the school record in the 110 Hurdles, which had stood for 30 years. He also played a major role in the lions going undefeated in dual meets over a three-year period in track and field.

Kevin Cudney (Class of 2005)

Varsity Sports Years: Soccer – three, Basketball – three, and Golf – six.

College: University at Buffalo

Kevin Cudney was an excellent athlete, who made All-League in all three sports -- soccer, basketball and golf. In his senior year, Kevin led his basketball team in three point field goal percentage and was chosen as a Second Team Great 8 Player.

In 2004, as the Lions goalkeeper in soccer, Kevin anchored the defense that had 15 shutouts and gave up only eight goals in 20 games. Both are school records that may stand for a long time. His 31 shutouts as a goalie is a record that may never be broken.
