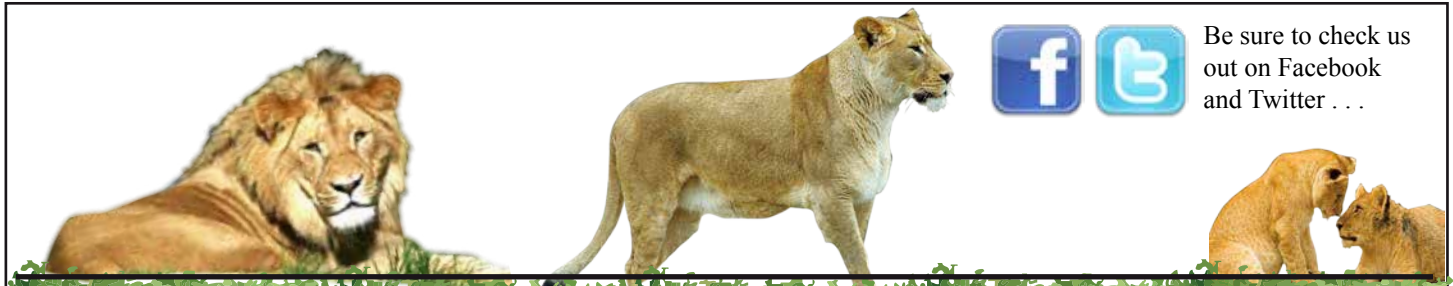

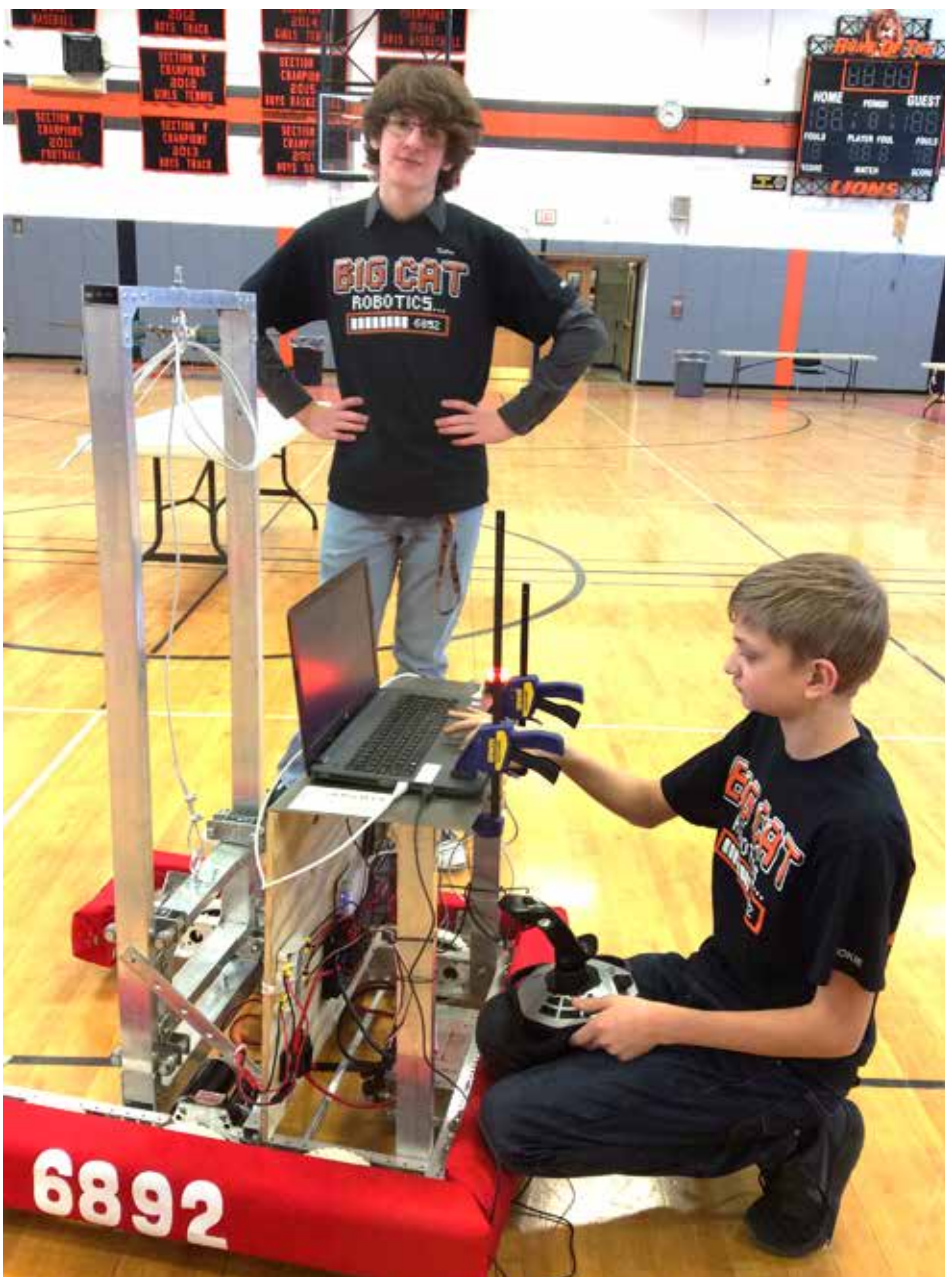

3 Vacancies on Board of Education

The Wellsville Central School Board of Education announces three school board vacancies expiring on June 30, 2018. All vacancies are for three-year terms and will expire June 30, 2021. Anyone interested in running for the school board can pick up a petition at the District Office located in the Secondary School Complex at 126 West State Street in Wellsville. Petitions require signatures of twenty-five (25) qualified voters of the district, and must be filed with the District Clerk at least thirty (30) days prior to the **vote on May 15, 2018**. The last day petitions can be accepted is April 16, 2018. Please direct any questions to Dawn Youmans, District Clerk, at 596-2170.

To qualify for membership on the school board, a candidate:

- Must be able to read and write.
- Must be a qualified voter of the district; that is, a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age or older, and not adjudged to be an incompetent.
- Must be and have been a resident (but need not be a taxpayer) of the district for a continuous and uninterrupted period of at least one year immediately before election.
- May not have been removed from any school district office within the preceding year.
- May not reside with another member of the same school board as a member of the same family.
- May not be a current employee of the school board.
- May not simultaneously hold another incompatible public office.

Absentee Ballots

You may apply for an absentee ballot at the office of the School District Clerk, Dawn Youmans, at 126 West State St., Wellsville, NY at least seven days before the vote (May 15, 2018), if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the budget vote, if the ballot is to be issued to the voter in person. Absentee ballots may not be mailed by the District Clerk earlier than 30 days before the vote. An absentee ballot must reach the office of the District Clerk, 126 West State St., Wellsville, NY not later than 5 p.m. on the day of the vote (5/15/18).

Wellsville Secondary School is proud to bring these characters to life in our 2018 spring production of *The Addams Family -- A Musical*.

Years have passed, and 20-year-old Wednesday (played by Maureen Willard) has fallen in love with Lucas (played by Forest Beauchamp), an ordinary man who has become enchanted by her extraordinary spirit. On April 20th, 21st and 22nd, audiences will come to the Wellsville Secondary School Auditorium to watch this delightfully funny show and see what happens when two very different worlds collide. "Playing Wednesday is a challenge because she is constantly shifting between her family's dark side and the lighter side of her new-found love. I am excited to enact this part because she has always been my favorite Addams." And playing the role of Lurch has left Junior Ryan Ludu speechless. Other cast members include Caleb Joseph as Gomez, Loralai Crawford as Morticia, Seth Tinder as Pugsley, and Sierra Dreibelbis as Grandma. Lucas' parents are being played by Nathan

Miles and Ellie Davis. The cast is rounded out with the Addams family ancestors: Natalie Taylor, Dewi Aquila, Aydrianna Weimer, Karizma Torruella, Trever Thomas, Jesse Slocum, Kiersten Koval, and Kati O'Neill.

This is the latest date we've ever performed a musical. High use of the auditorium has forced us to push the show into later April. A positive outcome of this is more

rehearsal time for the cast. "Extra rehearsals are giving our relatively inexperienced cast a chance to hone their skills and develop their characters," explains Lori Brown. "For seven of the cast members, this is their first WSS musical, and six others have only been in one other show."

Speak Out/Act Out Class Sees Play at Shea's



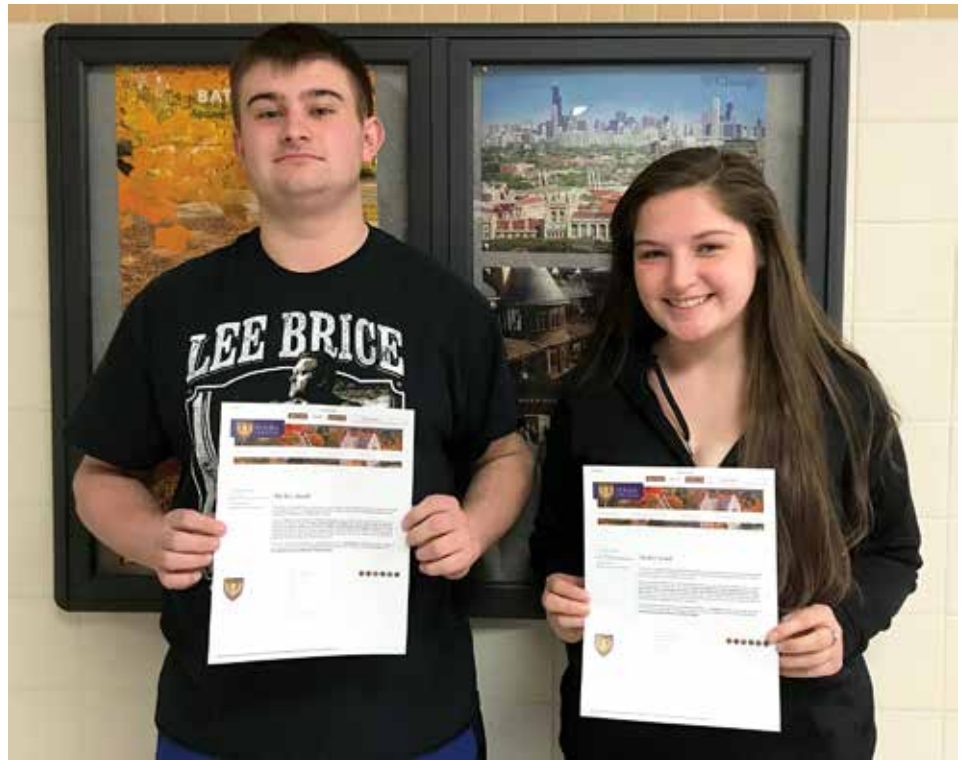

Elmira College Key Award

WSS is proud to announce the recipients of the Elmira College Key Award, from the Class of 2019, are **Daniel Reed** and **Skyler Schrlau** (*shown AT RIGHT*). The Key Award, sponsored by the Elmira College Alumni Association, has been awarded to fine students since 1935. The award of merit is presented to outstanding high school juniors in the top of their class with a minimum cumulative average of 90%. Candidates must also demonstrate school and community leadership.

A Key Award winner receives an \$80,000 tuition scholarship over a four-year period, \$20,000 per year, upon enrolling at Elmira College. The award is renewable each year with an academic average of 3.0 or higher. Recipients attending Elmira College are also honored in the fall of their freshman year by the Alumni Association and are presented with the prestigious Elmira College Key.

More Important Information for Seniors

■ Complete your Senior Data Sheet carefully and neatly and return it to the Guidance Office by April 23rd.

■ **Neatness Counts!** We cannot overemphasize this point. Write down all of your activities (but be scrupu-

lously honest), and write legibly and neatly in black ink. The **Senior Data Sheet** is how our community's scholarship donors will perceive you. Do not attach pages.

■ **Boys:** When you turn 18, remember to register for Selective Service online at www.sss.gov

■ Scholarship Night is set for Tuesday, June 5th. If you are going to receive an award, your parents or guardians will receive a letter. However, all seniors are encouraged to attend.

■ Please inform the Guidance Office of your post high school graduation plans, college acceptances, scholarship opportunities, job offers, etc.

■ Check with your chosen college now if you need tuition assistance.

■ Please do not count on local scholarships to meet a majority of your college costs. These one-time awards may help pay for some books and a small portion of tuition, but you should have a bigger financial plan in place.

■ **Do your very best** these last few months! Your senior year grades are important. A final transcript will be mailed to your college in early July.

News for Juniors

Start doing college research now! Visit prospective colleges! Many scholarships given in the fall and spring of next year are based on your community service hours. Remember to complete your student activities form, update it when needed and return it to the guidance office. Always do your best in your schoolwork! Your final three-year average will determine class rank, which is recorded on your high school transcript, and is needed for college and scholarship applications during your senior year.

Wells College 21st Century Leadership Award Winners

Recognizing the need for ethical leadership, Wells College presents the 21st Century Leadership Award to high school juniors who demonstrate leadership ability in high school and community activities and exhibit academic excellence. Recipients are nominated by their school counselor and the administration in the spring of their junior year and are then recognized by the Admissions Committee. The 21st Century Leadership Award program is designed to honor these students and grant them a \$40,000 Scholarship for Leaders (\$10,000 per year) for four years of study at Wells College.

The nominees must carry a cumulative average of at least 90% throughout high school. Wellsville Secondary School nominates Ashley Reitz and Morgan Sibble to receive the 21st Century Leadership Award at Wells College (see photo ABOVE).

NOW OF THE NEED TO OBTAIN A HEALTH EXAMINATION FOR NEXT SCHOOL YEAR.

- For the 2019-2020 school year, ONLY the approved NYSED form will be accepted.

Revisions to School Health Services Regulations Effective 7/1/18

Effective 7/1/2018, the mandated years for health exams and screening will change. In addition, only the approved NYS School Health Examination Form may be used to document health exams to provide consistency across the state.

The Changes Are Provided Below:

- Health Examinations will be required in grades PreK or K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11.
- Vision screening for distance and near vision acuity will be required within 6 months of admission to school and in grades PreK or K, 1, 3, 5, 7, and 11.



- Hearing screening utilizing pure tone testing will be required within 6 months of admission to school and in grades PreK or K, 1, 3, 5, 7, and 11.
- Scoliosis screening will be required in grades 5 and 7 for girls and grade 9 for boys.

What You Need To Know:

The use of the approved health form and changes to the grade level requirements are not effective until 7/1/18.

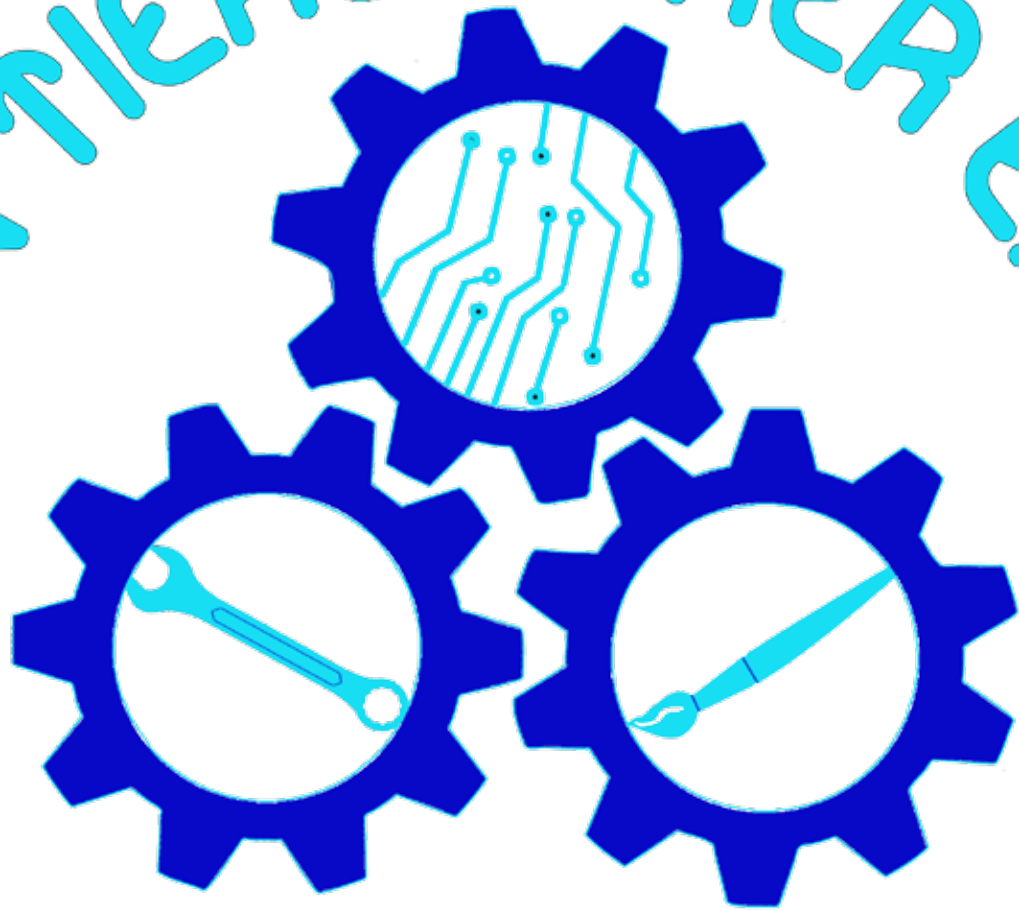
- Schools should use the current form and follow the current guidance for the remainder of this school year.
- 2018-19 is a transition year and any health exam form signed by a NYS Physician, Nurse Practitioner, or Physician Assistant may be accepted.
- Changes for screening grades are not effective until 7/1/18 and will not be implemented until the 2018-19 school year.
- **SCHOOLS SHOULD NOTIFY PARENTS/GUARDIANS WHOSE STUDENTS WILL BE IN GRADES PreK OR K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 AND 11 IN THE 2018-2019 SCHOOL YEAR**

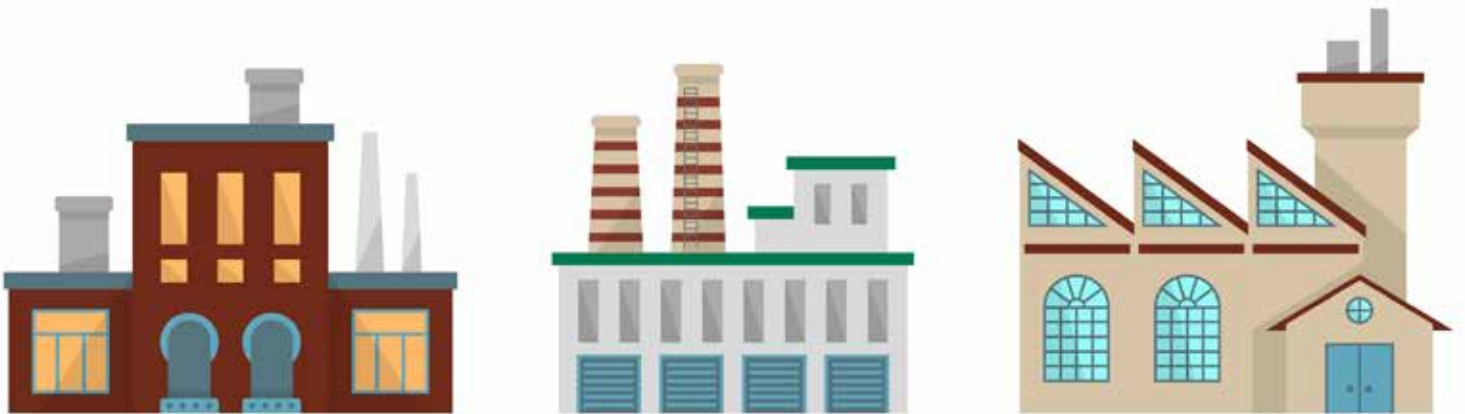


