Safety Committee Makes Recommendations to Improve School Safety

On April 1st, the Wellsville Safety Committee presented their findings and recommendations to the community and Board of Education at the April School Board Meeting. This committee met three times between January and March with the purpose of reviewing current safety practices and making suggestions to improve safety.

Three specific areas were focused on during the review. These were (1) During the school day, (2) Outside the school day, and (3) Mental health. The following individuals were members of the Wellsville Safety Committee: Chris Perkins (community member), Kris Green (community member), Michael Hunt (community member), Scott Cicirello (community member), Becky Brewsaugh (elementary school representative), Nate Kewley (elementary school representative),

Eli Marcus (secondary school representative), Shelly Chaffee (secondary school representative), Chad Green (School Resource Officer), Heather Gill (Board member), Keith Loines (Board member), and Steven Pettenati (Board member).

Action has already been taken to promote a safe school during the school day. Both campuses are fully secured during the day. Once the day begins, visitors may only enter at one door, and this door is monitored by school personnel. Once guests enter the building, they must pass a background check screening using the RAPTOR system. This year, Wellsville CSD partnered with the Village Police Department to place a School Resource Officer in our schools. Both campuses have security cameras that monitor activities inside and outside the buildings. In the event of an emergency, procedures are in place and regular practice drills are conducted. The primary recommendation from the Committee for improving safety during the school day is to take steps to improve the student crosswalk on West State Street during arrival and departure times. Other recommendations include increasing signage, installing alert systems, adjusting end-of-day pick-up procedures at the elementary school, and providing more training to substitute teachers.

Wellsville CSD is very proud that both campuses are so frequently used by community groups and organizations. The district has a strong desire to see this continue. Currently, in order to maintain safety, outside organizations are required to complete and submit a Building Use Application in order to use facilities. The district always has staff on duty when the building is in use. This includes custodial/maintenance staff and access to administration. The Safety Committee has two primary recommendations to improve safety outside regular school hours. The first is to tighten up the building use procedures. This could include training for those requesting to use the school and a greater effort to identify the school staff on duty, among other things. The District has purchased fluorescent vests so that school staff on duty will be easy to identify. The

second priority recommendation is to take steps to engage the community in supporting safety. This may include a safety tip-line, a visitor code of conduct, or many other efforts.

Over the past several years, Wellsville CSD has taken many steps to promote positive mental health with its students. There are four guidance counselors and two social workers, as well as a psychologist at each school, who work with the students in the district. A Family Resource Coordinator was recently hired to connect outside agencies to the students and families within the district. Students in both buildings receive instruction on topics to promote positive mental health. There is also a call-in number available to report instances of bullying. The Safety Committee recommends that the

district looks more closely at implementing Restorative Practices. This is a philosophy where relationships are built between students, or between students and teachers, and skills of communication, listening, empathy, and respect are developed. It is through these skills and relationships that problems/conflicts are resolved in productive and positive ways. The committee also suggests that alumni are brought back to share their own success stories.

Now that the School Safety Committee has made their recommendations, the district administration will begin to explore ways to implement them. As always, safety within the school is a top priority. Wellsville CSD is always looking to be proactive in maintaining safety within its schools. It is the hope of Superintendent David Foster and the School Board that the efforts of the School Safety Committee will result in safer campuses for our students and community.

FACS Relates Essential Life Skills

Family and Consumer Sciences (FACS Class) is best characterized as a course in essential life skills. The purpose of this class is for students to develop social, emotional, and organizational character traits that will help them become responsible and productive members of our society.

On Friday, May 3, 2019, Ms. Hillman, our district FACS teacher, organized a trip that took 17 of our eighth grade students to Alfred State College School of Applied Technology because the students had expressed great interest in learning about different trades that make our world livable. During the visit, the students explored careers in the Automotive, Building, Electrical, Culinary Arts, and Computerized Design and Manufacturing trades that are offered as educational programs with hands-on training.

Instructors and student representatives of Alfred State School of Applied Technology provided a guided tour of the campus, trade classrooms, and hands-on work areas. Additionally, each spoke about the importance of each trade to our society, and continued with information regarding curriculum, employment opportunities, and the profitability of these trades. Adding to the greatness of the day was our privilege to enjoy the amazing food and pastries prepared by the current students of the Culinary Arts program.

The opportunity was seized without hesitation and went off without a hitch. This trip marked the first time students at the middle level have had the opportunity to visit Alfred State College School of Applied Technology, and Ms. Hillman is already working to make it an annual experience.

The instructors from the School of Technology were thrilled when they learned that their guests would be middle-level students. Several instructors said, "It's important to get kids at this age level exposed to, and interested in, these types of careers because we need more skilled workers for these trades, and it gives them the time to think about the quality of life that these types of jobs offer with good benefits and wages." The world is constantly changing and the need, knowledge, and skill-set required for jobs that will be in high demand are constantly changing with it.

If you have NOT signed your child up, and wish to do so, please stop in at the elementary school office, as soon as possible, and pick up an enrollment packet.





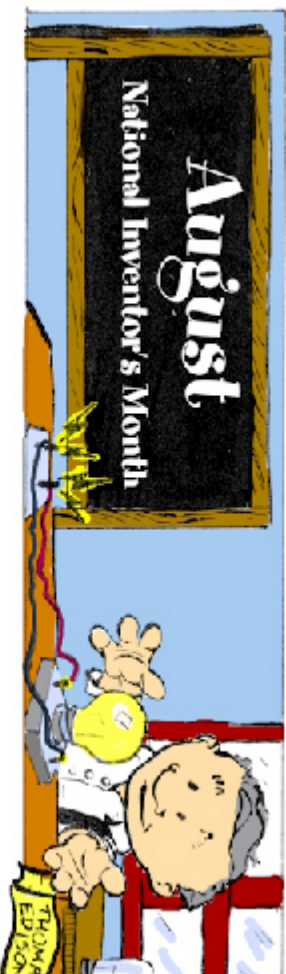
