Almost 300 participants registered for the event. Student booths included coding through apps, ping-pong cannon, an infinity light (*shown below*), dry ice bubbles, robotics, mummification, magnetic slime, a tesla coil and crocheting. Several hands-on booths were

set up as well such as making cloud dough and magic sand, water balz, a milk jug igloo, Popsicle stick explosions and throwies. The cardboard city created by children at the end was a huge hit, complete with cardboard airplane.

Many people said they came planning to stay for 30 minutes and ended up staying for over three hours! Participants were able to take what they made with their hands and

Board Vacancies

The Wellsville Central School Board of Education announces one school board vacancy expiring on June 30, 2016. This vacancy is for a three-year term and will expire June 30, 2019. Anyone interested in running for the school board can pick up a petition at the District Office located in the MS/HS complex at 126 West State Street in Wellsville. The petition requires signatures of twenty-five (25) qualified voters of the district, and must be filed with the District Clerk at least thirty (30) days prior to the budget vote on May 17, 2016. The last day petitions can be accepted is April 18, 2016. Please direct any questions you may have to District Clerk Dawn Youmans at 596-2170.

To qualify for membership on the school board, a candidate . . .

- MUST be able to read and write.
- MUST be a qualified voter of the district; that is, a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age or older, and not adjudged to be an incompetent.
- MUST be and have been a resident (but need not be a taxpayer) of the district for a continuous and uninterrupted period of at least one year immediately before election.
- MAY NOT have been removed from any school district office within the preceding year.
- MAY NOT reside with another member of the same school board as a member of the same family.
- MAY NOT be a current employee of the school board.
- MAY NOT simultaneously hold another incompatible public office.

Absentee Ballots

Absentee ballots may be applied for at the office of the School District Clerk, Dawn Youmans, at 126 West State St., Wellsville, NY at least seven days before the date of the budget vote (May 17, 2016) if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the budget vote if the ballot is to be issued to the voter in person. Absentee ballots may not be mailed by the District Clerk earlier than 30 days before the vote. An absentee ballot must reach the office of the District Clerk, 126 West State St., Wellsville, NY not later than 5:00 p.m. on the day of the budget vote.

Steadman Earns Leadership Award from Wells College

Wellsville High School's nominee to receive the 21st Century Leadership Award at Wells College is **Isabella Steadman** (*at left*). Recognizing the need for ethical leadership, Wells College presents this award to high school juniors who demonstrate leadership ability in their high school and through community activities and who also exhibit academic excellence. Recipients are nominated by their high school guidance counselor and their school's administration during the spring of their junior year and they are then recognized by the Admissions Committee. The 21st Century Leadership Award program is designed to honor these students and grant them a \$40,000 Scholarship for Leaders (\$10,000 per year) for four years of study at Wells College. The nominee must carry a cumulative average of at least 90% throughout high school.



In order to advance in the quarterfinal round of the competition, a group must place in the top three. W.A.V.E. took the runner-up spot and advanced to the semifinals in Wakefield, MA the following weekend. Neil Stanton also received a special award for Outstanding Vocal Percussionist for the entire set. W.A.V.E. performed in the semifinals on Saturday, March 5, 2016. They received valuable feedback and were recognized as National Semifinalists.

This album will feature 10 tracks -- recorded, edited, mixed, and mastered by *Liquid 5th Productions*, an award-winning recording studio based in North Carolina.

In order to have a child, they must enter the woods and complete 4 tasks which she gives them. Their quest brings them in contact with Cinderella (performed by Sydney Sisson), her Prince (Byron Grover), and her family; Jack -- of Beanstalk fame -- and his Mother (Jacob Seeley and Maureen Willard); Little Red Ridinghood (Brittany Childs), her Granny (Isabella Steadman), and the Wolf (Alex Closson); and Rapunzel and her Prince (Caitlyn Whitfield & Dominic Murray). And, of course, there is a Narrator (Jason Greene), who stands on the outside telling the story. Each character ultimately impacts the others.

The production is being directed by Lori Brown, with assistance from music director Cody Hampton and choreographer Heidi Mangels. Mrs. Brown is excited about the work the cast is doing. She said, "We have some wonderful veteran cast members who are doing a terrific job in their own roles, along with helping out some of the players who are new to our stage. These sheets are very important to seniors in order to be considered for any local scholarships. If you have any questions concerning these sheets, please see guidance.

More Important Information for Seniors (Class of 2016):

■ **Complete your Senior Data Sheet carefully and neatly and return it to the Guidance Office by April 22. Neatness counts!** We cannot overemphasize this point. Write down all of your activities (but be

scrupulously honest), and write legibly and neatly in black ink. The Senior Data Sheet is how our community's scholarship donors will perceive you. Do not attach pages.

■ Boys, when you turn 18, you must register for Selective Service online at www.sss.gov

■ Scholarship Night is set for Tuesday, June 7. If you are going to receive an award, your parents or guardians will receive a letter. However, all seniors are encouraged to attend.

■ Please inform the Guidance Office of your post high school graduation plans, college acceptances, scholarship opportunities, job offers, etc.

■ Check with your chosen college now if you need tuition assistance.

■ Please do not count on local scholarships to underwrite a majority of your college costs. These one-time awards may help pay for some books

and perhaps a small portion of tuition. You should already have a financial plan in place.

■ Do your **VERY BEST** these last few months! Your senior year grades are important. A final transcript will be mailed to your college in early July.

News for Juniors

Start doing college research now! Visit prospective colleges! Many scholarships given in the fall and spring of next year are based on your community service hours. Remember to complete your student activities form, update it when needed and return it to the guidance office. Always do your best in your schoolwork! Your final three-year average will determine class rank, which is recorded on your high school transcript and needed for college and scholarship applications during your senior year.

University of Rochester Announces Scholarships at WHS

Since 1933, the University of Rochester has maintained a tradition of helping high schools recognize their most talented students. The University of Rochester currently offers awards to recognize outstanding juniors in high school.

To be considered for these scholarships, students must first apply for admissions to the University. Upon application for admission, winners are automatically considered for the respective scholarship. The scholarship provides each qualified student \$7,500 to \$20,000 per year for four years. Selection for these scholarships is competitive and is based upon the overall strength of the student's application for admission.

The University of Rochester is proud to continue the tradition of the Bausch and Lomb Honorary Science Award, awarded each year to high school juniors who demonstrate exceptional promise in the sciences. Wellsville High School's nominee to receive the Bausch & Lomb Honorary Science Award is **Madison Ewing**.

Rachael Ferraloro has been nominated by WHS to receive the University of Rochester's Humanities/Social Sciences Award.

This award is named in honor of famous Rochester natives Frederick Douglass and Susan B. Anthony. The University is proud to continue the tradition of these pioneers through extensive research and study devoted to social justice and human rights.

Wellsville High School's third nominee is **Sydney Sisson**. Sydney has been nominated for the George Eastman Young Leaders Award. Selection for this award is based upon strong leadership experience at school and in the community and extensive involvement in extracurricular activities.

Wellsville High School's fourth and final nominee is **Dakota Dickerson**. Dakota is our nominee for the University of Rochester's Xerox Award for Innovation and Information Technology. The junior nominated for this award should demonstrate achievement in the pursuit of innovative approaches.

Each year, more than 3,000 high schools around the world participate in this award recognition program. Congratulations to our nominees!

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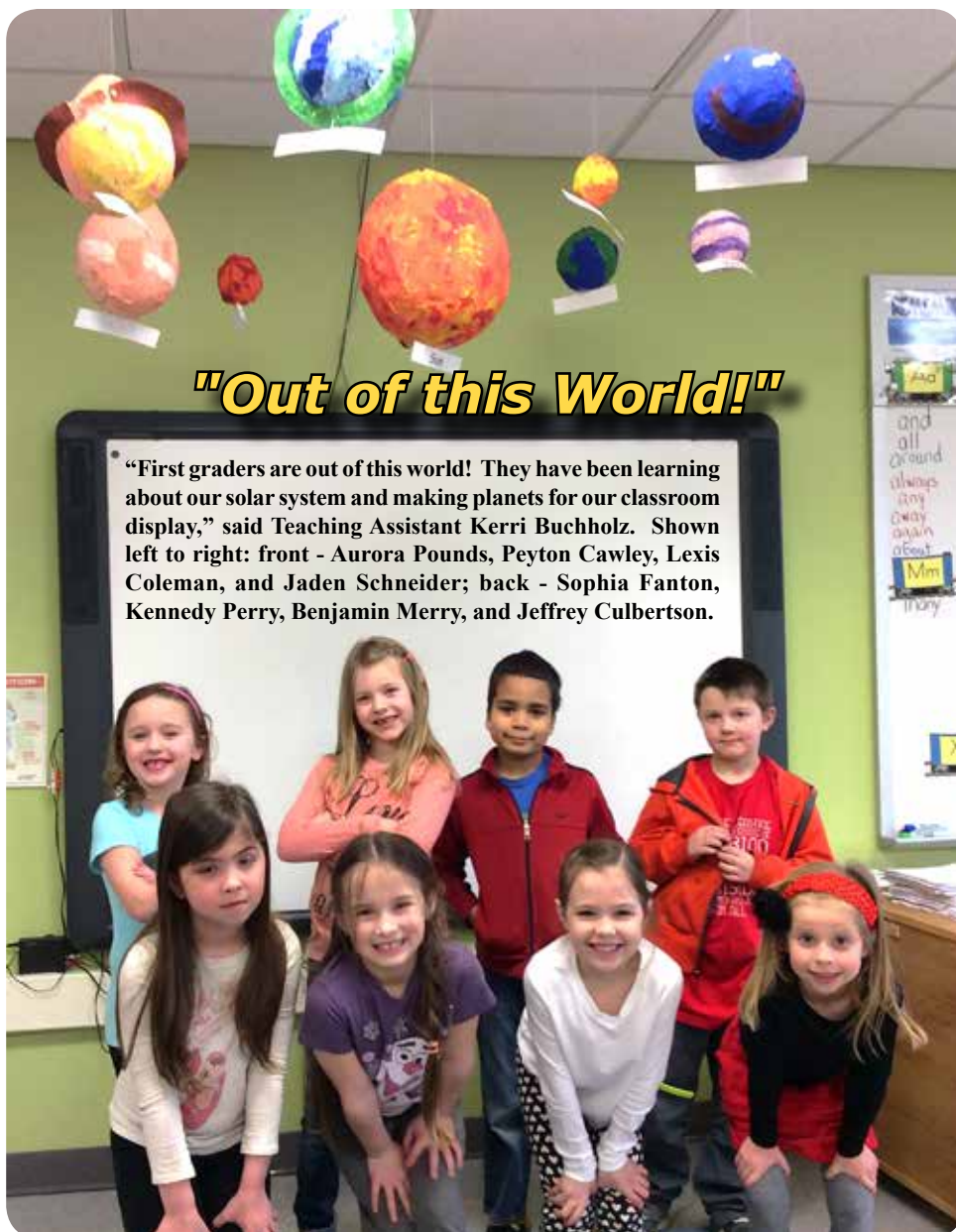
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Tomak is Elmira College Key Award Winner

Senior **Emily Tomak** (*above*) is the WHS recipient of the Elmira College Key Award, which is sponsored by the Elmira College Alumni Association, and has been awarded to fine students since 1935. The award of merit is presented to outstanding high school juniors in the top of their class with a minimum cumulative average of 90%. Candidates must also demonstrate school and community leadership. Key Award winners receive an \$80,000 tuition scholarship over a four-year period (\$20,000 per year) upon enrolling at Elmira College. The award is renewable each year with an academic average of 3.0 or higher. Recipients attending Elmira College are also honored in the fall of their freshman year by the Alumni Association and are presented with the prestigious Elmira College Key.
